 These scores are the National Percentile of the Normal Curve Equivalent. The NP of the NCE.
 The NP of the NCE is referring the NCE(equal intervals) to the NP (unequal intervals). The NP is a ranking.

Archdiocese = the entire system of Catholic Schools
 City = The Catholic schools in the City of Chicago
 Big Shoulders = Inner City Catholic Schools in the City of Chicago (94 elementary schools)

The Terra Nova II is an updated version of Terra Nova I and was normed in 2000.
 The Students of the Archdiocese of Chicago performed very well on the Terra Nova II (CTB Co.) Spring Test.
 In Grades 3,5 & 7, the Archdiocesan and City of Chicago scores are above the National Norm in all categories.
 With the exception of Math & Science in Grade 3 for Big Shoulders & Science Grade 5 Big Shoulders,
 the difference between test scores achieved and the National Norm are NOT significant.
 The Total Battery Score for each population group are all above the National Norm. The difference in Big Shoulders
 Battery Score is not significant.
 Hence, all the students performed very well.

Again, it is true that the longer a student remains in the system, the greater his/her achievement.
